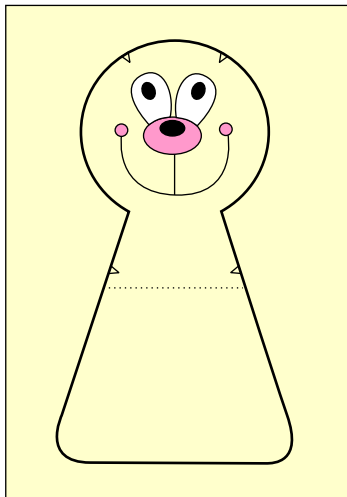
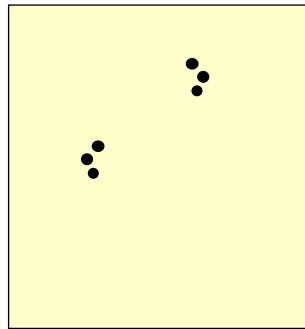
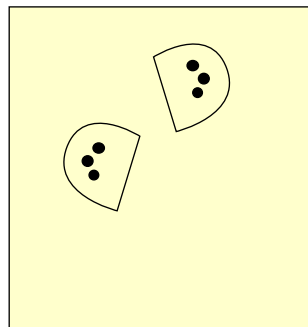


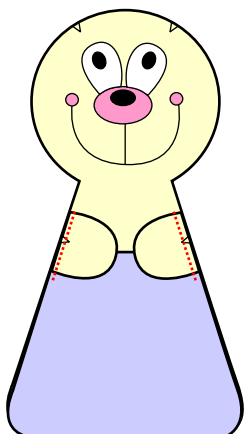
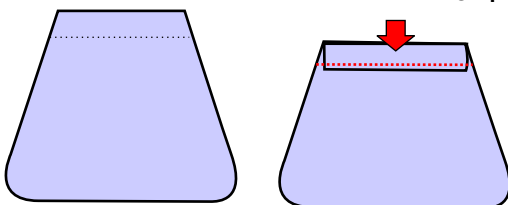
1. Embroidery your Easter Bunny Face and paws onto a your fabric. Leave enough fabric overhanging around the embroidery designs to cut your pattern pieces.



2. Place your pattern shapes over the embroidery, pin in place and then cut our your pattern pieces. Cut out the remaining pattern pieces.



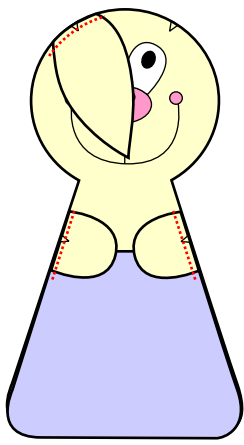
3. Fold the top line of the pocket down and stitch in place.



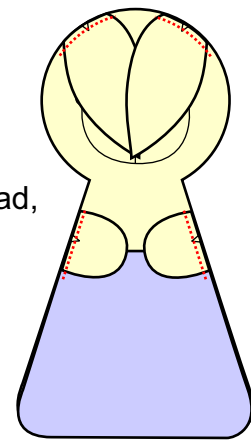
4. Place the pocket on the bunny body with the sewn edge facing down.

5. Place the embroidered paw (facing down) onto the bunny body lining up the arrows, shown left.

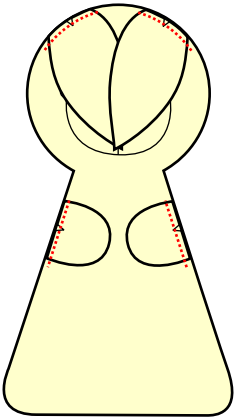
6. Stitch the paws in place 1/4 inch from the edge.



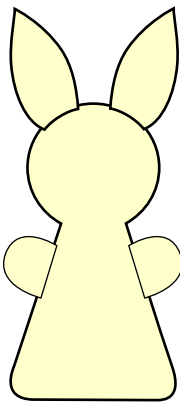
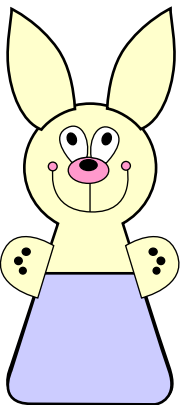
5. Iron on your iron on interfacing to both ears onto the wrong side of the fabric.
6. Place the left ear in place facing in and right side down, matching the arrows to the bunny head, shown left.
7. Stitch the ear in place 1/4 inch from the edge.



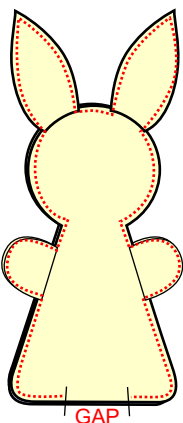
8. Repeat for the right ear, stitching in place.



9. Now repeat steps 4 - 7 for the back of the bunny.

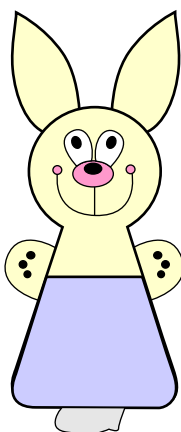


10. Fold out and iron down the ears and paws.



11. Now place the right side of the bunny back to the right side of the bunny front. Leaving a 10cm gap at the bottom now stitch 1/4 inch around the entire bunny body, shown left.

12. Now cut around the edges where you have sewn. Make sure to cut into each angled corner (making sure not to cut through your stitched line).



13. Turn inside out and push out all of the corners. Iron down flat.
14. In the opening at the bottom of the bunny stuff it with some hobby fill so that its filled but also ensure there is enough room to place an easter egg inside the pocket.

Then place your craft stick inside through the centre and hand stitch the edge closed around the craft stick.
